HIGHLIGHTS... Meeting of Students, Volunteers and Parents

On July 2nd 2005, volunteers, students and their parents of Nepalgunj gathered in Bageshowari Temple for a small, yet important, meeting.



With fifteen participants, the meeting focused on informing parents about their children's education status, the importance of nutrition and sanitation, and NCEF rules and regulations. The assembled group also made a decision to hold similar meetings in quarterly basis.

Apsara Khanal, one of the volunteers in Nepalgunj, stated the following: "Because of the meeting, our closeness with the students and their families has increased and a more comfortable and family-like environment has been created." She asserted that this event helped to provide awareness regarding the importance of education to parents, who were then in turn motivated to pass this knowledge to their children.

SLC Results: All NCEF Students Have Passed exam

All five NCEF students who took the SLC (School Leaving Certificate) exam this year have successfully opened up "the iron gate." In other words, students have passed the exam that signifies the completion of tenth grade.

Out of 216,303 Nepalese tenth graders who took the SLC exam this year, only 39% passed. Such a low passing rate indicates the level of difficulty of this exam. As such, it is great news that all five NCEF supported students passed this exam.

Did You Know?

- <u>Gross Enrollment Ratios (%)</u> in pre-primary (kindergartens), primary (grades 1-5), secondary (grades 6-12), and post secondary (university) educations are 20%, 120%, 42% and 3% respectively.
- Pupil teacher ratio is 1:36 (headcounts).
- Only 48.8% of the adult population (15 years and older) and 70.35% of youth population (15 to 24 years) are literate.
- Only 14.9% of government funds go towards education.
- Only US\$100 is required to put a student in Nepal through a year of school.
